The Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation (MVCSC) is asking anyone living in our district to be a part of the "MV Community Champions" fall initiative to develop a 10-year Future Growth Plan. MVCSC is asking hundreds of community members to attend two evening meetings for one hour each on August 27, 2019 and January 21, 2020. Attendees will share their thoughts on the multiple options of growth possibilities, including how grade configurations are assigned in our schools. NEW AND RETURNING STUDENT REGISTRATION

Parents/guardians should register their returning Mt. Vernon student prior to the first day of school by logging into Skyward Family Access and clicking on the "Returning Student Registration" tab. Notification will be sent out in July when registration becomes available in Skyward Family Access. Parents/guardians of returning out-of-district students who have received an approval letter for the 19-20 school year should also register their students through Skyward Family Access. Parents/guardians of new MVCSC students and new out-of-district students who have received an approval letter for the 19-20 school year should follow the "New Student Enrollment" link found on our webpage under Choose MV/ Enrollment Forms. You are encouraged to complete Online New Student Enrollment prior to Centralized Registration on July 18.

If no one attends, the student will receive their schedule on the first day of school. At Centralized Registration, parents/guardians and students will:

School begins July 31, are your child's immunizations up-to-date? Indiana law requires each child enrolled in school to be completely immunized against communicable diseases. For students new to the school system – including kindergartners – this record must be on file before the child can attend classes. Please refer to the Health Services website page for immunization details.

ELEMENTARY & MIDDLE SCHOOL SUPPLY LISTS

Requested school supplies are listed under the "Parents" dropdown on each school's website, on the "Forms & Resources" page. (High school supplies vary per class and will be shared with students on the first day of school.)

TRANSPORTATION

On the first day of school, students should be ready for their bus at least one hour before school starts. Approximate pick-up times will be set within a few days of the start of school and will be posted on the MVCSC Transportation Department website page by July 24.

MVCSC provides parents/guardians with a **free app that shows their bus location in real-time!** Visit the

transportation department's web page to learn how to create a "Don't Miss the Bus" account. Students will be assigned a bus number after details are posted on the website by July 24.

NEW CHARGE POLICY

The Mt. Vernon Food Service Department has established an updated charge policy to ensure all students continue to have access to nutritious, quality meals. Charge Policy Summary:

- Significant negative lunch account balances (any balance owed in excess of \$10.00) shall not be permitted.
- If a student has a significant negative balance, s/he shall be provided a regular reimbursable meal that follows the USDA meal pattern, the cost of which shall continue to accrue to his/her negative balance.
- A student with a significant negative account balance shall not be permitted to charge any a la carte food, beverage items, or extras.
- Any significant negative balance will be pursued for collection.

The Food Service Department will send out negative balance notifications. In addition, parents may choose to set up low-balance notifications through Skyward Family Access and SchoolPay. SchoolPay also allows an option to set up automatic payments to ensure your student always has sufficient funds for meals. For more information, please refer to the Food Services page on Mt. Vernon's website.

MEAL ASSISTANCE

After August 22, 2019, any family wishing to apply for meal assistance may do so by logging into Skyward Family Access, opening the Food Service tab and clicking on Applications. Students eligible for free or reduced lunch assistance may qualify for textbook rental fee assistance; watch for textbook rental assistance option in the online application.

MEAL PAYMENT OPTIONS

Parents/guardians may deposit funds into their child's account online through SchoolPay. You may transfer money into your child's account, load funds, and set alerts using this system. We also accept cash and checks. If writing checks, we ask you put the student's name in the memo section.

PAYING TEXTBOOK RENTAL FEES

Textbook rental fees are due at the beginning of the school year after they are posted in the Skyward accounts. Payments can be made by cash, check, Visa or Mastercard.

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
STUDENT DEVICE PROTECTION PLAN
