Mt Vernon Community School Corporation is excited to announce that we were rated as an "A District" by the Indiana Department of Education for the 2017-2018 school year.





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About Superintendent Dr. Jack Parker

Dr. Parker was in

his sixth year of central office experience at Center Grove Schools as the Assistant Superintendent of Teaching and Learning. Prior to that position, he served as a Principal and Assistant Principal at Center Grove Middle School Central where his school received a Blue Ribbon Award nomination. He was named Middle School Principal of the Year in 2013 and 2009 by the Indiana Association of School Principals.

He also recently helped with the strategic planning of the Indiana School Boards Association as a co-facilitator and consultant.

MVCSC Receives a STEM Acceleration Grant

Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation (MVCSC) was recently awarded with a K-6 STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) Acceleration Grant from the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE). In recent years, both the IDOE and MVCSC have focused on a multitude of efforts to increase the STEM initiative in schools. The IDOE awarded

MVCSC nearly \$50,000 to further advance STEM education in the elementary and middle schools.

Mt. Vernon schools are dedicated to the implementation of STEM efforts, demonstrated by the district's K-12 STEM certification and 1:1 technology program. Additionally, MVCSC has a STEM teacher in each elementary school, a STEM business teacher at the middle school, and a Technology Integration Specialist in both the elementary and secondary levels.

Moving forward, MVCSC wants to continue the shift from teaching students how to be consumers of technology, to teaching students how to become creators and innovative problem solvers.

MVCSC plans to use the funding from the grant to improve curriculum, programming, community outreach and professional development for educators.

Furthermore, the district wants to incorporate more computer science education for students in grades K-6. Through this grant, MVCSC is committed to attending

MVCSC has also delivered the "Don't Miss the Bus" app for students/parents to follow their bus location in real time and know when to walk to their bus stop. The user can set a customized boundary on the app and push notifications are then sent when the bus enters that boundary.

a District SCRIPTS Computer Science Strategic Planning Workshop in order to continue improving the computer science education implemented throughout the schools.

Students attend STEM classes each week and use a computer science pathway with their devices. In addition to this, MVCSC plans to use the grant to implement a Makerspace that can be used by K-6 students, such as 3D printers, VR glasses, and Merge Cubes.

The Director of Elementary Education, Mrs. Heather Noesges, shared, "Our goal is to provide support and resources for our teachers to be able to integrate STEM throughout the curriculum. We are appreciative of the IDOE's STEM leadership, and are proud of our accomplishments and the impact it has on enhancing our learners' education."

The goal of the district as a whole is to raise the overall student participation of STEM. Teachers will go through continuous training in order to effectively implement STEM into their daily lessons.

Discontinue Transfer/Out-of-District Students

At the October Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation's Board of Trustees meeting, a resolution was passed to not accept new transfer/out-of-district students. This resolution is effective October 1, 2018 through June 1, 2019 for students in preschool through grade 12. The Board of Trustees passed this resolution due to the in-district housing growth that is impacting the Mt. Vernon schools.

Currently enrolled transfer/out-of-district students and their siblings, foreign exchange students attending through a contractual relationship, and employees' children, are exempt from this resolution and may attend school at Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation (MVCSC).

The transfer/out-of-district student resolution will be reevaluated each spring. Out-of-district parents/guardians who are interested in having their child(ren) attend Mt. Vernon should contact the school after April 2019 to see if the MVCSC School Board of Trustees has chosen to modify or keep this resolution the same for the following year.

MVCSC administration meets quarterly with economic development representatives from the county and all three towns in our district to assess housing growth and developments. This information helps Mt. Vernon evaluate data and prepare for future growth.

GLEANERS/ MT. VERNON HIGH SCHOOL PANTRY

MVCSC hosts a Gleaners / Mt. Vernon High School (MVHS) Food Pantry once per month for our food insecure families. On specific Thursdays from 4:00-5:30 p.m., the Food Pantry will be open at MVHS, Door #12 for Mt. Vernon families with a voucher. The voucher simply verifies that the family has a student enrolled in a Mt. Vernon school and can be picked up in the Main Office of any



school. The monthly food pantry dates can also be found on the website page under the "community" tab.

If your child is in need of new or gently used clothing, please let your school counselor know of their specific clothing need. The district has a Mt. Vernon Cooperative Closet that is filled with clothes (including pants, shirts, coats, hats and gloves)
